Campus Activity Fee Increase

Why or Why Not?

What is it?

The Campus Activity Fee is the primary source of funding for the Associated Students. The current \$13.50 charged per student per quarter is allocated to provide services and to represent students at UCSD. An increase in this fee would fund items such as student organization programming, A.S. all-campus Programming like Sun God Festival, WinterFest and TG's, External Affairs, College Councils, and campus alternative media. Financial Aid will cover the increase since it is a mandatory student fee. The proposed increase is for \$6.50 per undergraduate student per quarter.

- The last ASUCSD activity fee increase was
- approved by students in 1985;
- Financial Aid will cover this mandatory fee increase, as appropriate to your individual circumstance;

Pro

- The value of the current \$13.50 activity fee has decreased \$7.00 since 1985, as a result of inflation:
- Post Campus Climate Survey (Spring, 1997), the survey committee recommended an increase in the ASUCSD activity fee to enhance the out-of-classroom experience for students;
- Increased funding for sports clubs, colleges, and better all-campus programming (i.e., WinterFest, Fall Festival and bigger Sun God Festival);
- The 1997-98 requests for funding by our 275 registered student organizations far exceeded the dollars available. The activities/events/ programs sponsored by UCSD student organizations would be enhanced by this \$6.50 fee increase.

- Students selected by you (ASUCSD Council) will make all decisions regard allocation of these increased dollars.
- UCSD has the second lowest campus activities fee in the UC system.

Con

- Students already pay enough fees to attend UCSD
- Instead of raising fees, the A.S. should better manage the money it already spends
- \$6.50 increase per student per quarter is too much for students to pay all at once.
- Although the ASUCSD Council will make all decisions regarding allocation of these increased

funds, there is no definite guarantee of where the money goes.

REFERENDUM #2

The Academic Success Program

This fee referendum will establish a constitutional lock-in at \$1 per student/quarter student activity fee increase to support the Academic Senate Program. A.S. Council will oversee ASP financial expenditures according to the monetary policy in the ASUCSD Constitution.

The Academic Success Program is a student organization at UCSD that is attempting to provide a better academic and social environment at UCSD through the following preliminary programs:

- Book-Lending Program would save students money by providing books to borrow quarterly.
- Peer Mentorship Program would connect incoming students to their own peers with the same academic and social interests to provide a more pleasant environment.
- Peer Tutoring Program would provide students with more information on current tutoring programs available (i.e., OASIS)
- · Exam Archives Program would allow students to borrow past exams as a reference.
